

Fr. Cody's Corner



Our God is a personal God. And, yes, that means its personal. But what does this mean? Our God is not in the abstract. For instance, I would not say that I took reason to the park and we had a fun time playing in the sand. No, I would say, I went with Jacob to the park and we swung on the swings. The same works for God. Our God is not in the abstract, which is very difficult to relate to. Our God is a person, someone like us whom we can call by name. Think about this for a moment. When I want to pray to God, I can call him by name: God, Father, Jesus, Holy Spirit, Almighty One. Yet, we are not limited to only these titles. When you pray, use titles that make sense and help you to understand God. For our goal is to be able to talk directly with God.

Years ago I was reading a book in preparation to be ordained a deacon. In the book the author encouraged us to call God our Father and to speak to him in that way: "Father, I need your help right now." I took this idea to heart and tried to speak more directly and to use this title. It was hard. I struggled with that title for quite a while because it felt weird to make God so personal. I sense that many of you will feel the same way. Once we make God personal, relate to him as a person, the whole character of the relationship changes. God becomes real. He becomes like me. So, when you pray, take the time to be direct. Address God like you are talking to a friend. If it feels weird and challenging, good, keep at it. God wants to hear from you.

Why Go to Confession?

(From GoodConfession.com)

- **1. It helps us overcome vice** The grace we receive from the Sacrament of Confession helps us combat our faults and failings and break our habits of vice much more easily and expediently than we could otherwise do without the sacramental grace.
- **2. It helps us become more like Jesus** Jesus was perfectly humble, perfectly loving–perfectly everything! Don't you wish you could be as humble, generous, patient, and loving as Jesus? Saints throughout history have felt that way too, and they have frequented the Sacrament of Reconciliation to help transform them into people who are more like Christ. Little images of Christ—that's what saints are!
- **3. It brings us peace** Guilt from the sins we commit can make us feel all mixed up inside and cause us to lose our peace and joy. When we hear God's forgiving words to us from the lips of the priest in Confession, a burden is lifted off our shoulders. With this sacrament, we can again feel the peace of heart and soul that comes from being in a good relationship with God.



Do you take Communion to... The homebound? A loved one? A neighbor? Please allow us to remember and pray for those who are not able to celebrate with us.

We have a new process for those taking Communion to others:

- 1. Please notify the priest when you arrive.
- 2. Take your pyx to the gifts table and put in as many hosts as you'll need from under the table.
- 3. Place your pyx on the plate with the bread.

After Communion the priest will call you forward to receive your pyx and offer a prayer.

* PLEASE make sure the bottom of your pyx is marked with your name.



Terms to Know from TeamRCIA.com

Candidate: a baptized Christian who is preparing to become a Catholic; in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), the term "candidate" is also used to refer to the subjects of a rite, which includes catechumens and inquirers.

Our Candidates are Michael Delaney and Annie Jeffries.

Elect: name given to catechumens chosen by God and affirmed by the Church as ready to celebrate baptism, confirmation, and Eucharist at the next Easter Vigil; catechumens who have gone through the Rite of Election or Enrollment Rite on the first Sunday of Lent; the elect are those who are involved in immediate preparation for initiation at the upcoming Easter Vigil.

Our Elect is Meaghan Nelson. See her picture and bio on the back wall in the Church!

Election: the formal liturgical act of choosing those who have been called by God to celebrate the initiation sacraments; the election is proclaimed by the Bishop of a diocese.

Enrollment of names: another name for the Rite of Election; the formal liturgical act of gathering and recording the names of those ready to be initiated at the next Easter Vigil.

Guatemala Moment



Decades ago, Fr. Jim Hazelton recognized the importance of basic education in the lives of the young. He founded La Asuncion School twenty years ago, providing a passport from poverty to some of the neediest Guatemalan youth.

The school presently has an enrollment of 275 students who are receiving an education for little or no cost. The student body has a somewhat higher number of female students, who rarely have the opportunity for education beyond middle school.



The unemployment rate is Guatemala has been exacerbated by the mechanization of sugarcane harvesting and a highly competitive coffee bean market.



In hopes of creating new job opportunities for the Guatemalan youth, the school administrators are planning an innovative vocational curriculum that includes computer

education, sewing and tailoring, welding and car repair; all highly marketable skills.
