A Note From Father Jeff

NEXT STEPS

We have begun a message series called Next Steps. As Christians we are called to be students or followers of Jesus Christ, this is discipleship. Following Jesus is a journey. And any journey is simply made up of steps. At CTK, we have identified some simple steps of discipleship. Here are the steps that we have identified. Here is a brief outline of these steps.

S.T.E.P.S. is an acronym. The **S** is all about **serve** or service. Service in ministry and mission. Jesus called himself a servant. That was his preferred title and he want his followers to be like that too. We serve in our parish (ministry). We invite you to serve your fellow parishioners and the parish. You can go to our web-site, www.cktmsla.com, go to the Next Steps button and then select serve in Ministry. We also serve outside our parish (mission).



T is for **tithe** - tithing or giving. Our God is generous. Our God is a giver. Our God invites us to be generous too.

E is for **engage**. Which is how we talk about growing in our faith through small groups. Faith is personal. It is not private. It is meant to be, it must be, lived in a community of believers.

The **P** is about the **practice** of prayer and sacraments. We are called to spend quiet time with Jesus every day and we gather together to worship and pray at Mass.

The final **S** is about **sharing** our faith. Because sharing your faith is actually the fastest and best way to grow our faith.

A few caveats to remember: these steps are not obligation; they are only invitations. These steps are not meant to get you do to more stuff; we are all busy enough. These are aimed at simplifying your life, not complicating it. Finally, pick the right next step for you. These steps are to be taken one at a time and in the order that God's invites you to take them.

Discipleship is simply about following the Lord step by step. It is not about perfection. It is about direction, the direction of discipleship. Day by day, step by step, a little bit more today than yesterday, a little bit more tomorrow than today. And in the process, we become who God wants us to be.

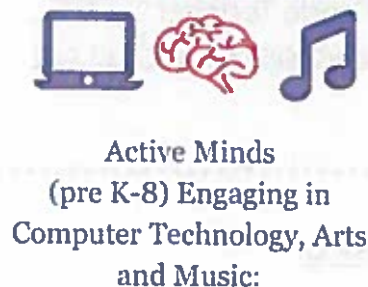

Fr. Cody's Corner



Have you thought of liturgy as prayer? You know Mass, the Sunday service, that thing we do on Sunday. Liturgy is a form of prayer, or should be a form of prayer. You may be surprised that I used the word "liturgy" instead of "Mass." The word liturgy encompasses more than just Mass. Liturgy includes all seven Sacraments, the Liturgy of the Hours, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, and Liturgy of the Word (like Mass but without Communion).

But let me take a step back for a moment. What is liturgy? Liturgy is the work of the people. More specifically it is a public work. Think of it this way, if we planned to build a statue for Missoula, a park, or a new stadium, all of these projects benefit everyone. We work together to plan, develop, and build. Then we all share in the benefit of having the new space or building. The same idea applies to our liturgical celebrations. Whenever we celebrate Mass, a baptism, marriage, or any of the other forms of liturgy, we are not simply spectators enjoying the moment with God. Instead we are active participants praying and adding our support as we pray for the world and make God present to the world. We are performing a work that benefits all people.

If you are having trouble with this concept or not sure what to do with what I have said, try these ideas. What are we doing during the Mass? We listen to God speak to each and every one of us – the readings. We pray for the needs of the world – the prayers of the faithful. We make God present to us and the world – the Eucharistic Prayer. In every form of liturgy we are doing essentially all three of these things. For example, baptism: listening to God's word – readings; praying for the world – litany of the saints, prayers of the faithful; making God present, invoking the Holy Spirit upon the water, new birth of the child through baptism. Try this out. Listen for whom we are praying to and for what when each prayer is prayed. This attentive listening will guide you to experience what liturgy is all about.
