A Note From Fr. Jeff

Transitions

As I write this, I am ever aware of the coming changes for you and for me. Transitions are difficult, but necessary. That doesn't lessen that pain and discomfort we feel, but I also trust that this is the work and will of the Holy Spirit. I trust that the Holy Spirit will lead and guide each one of us into a beautiful future. This can be a time of great growth.

While change and transition are inevitable and constant, how we deal with them is important. I have come across a model of transition that I would like to share with you.

This model starts with the **Endings**. The next stage is the **Neutral Zone** and finally we emerge into the **New Beginning**.

The Endings — whenever we experience change, whether it is good or not so good, we all experience loss. We need to consider what am I losing. There are seven types of loss: turf, attachments to people, meaning, control, future, identity, or structure. This applies to positive and negative changes – the same amount of stress of anxiety applies. So what are your areas of loss? Everyone has different issues of loss, some may express a loss completely differently than someone else. For me personally, I will be experiencing a loss of identity as your pastor, most of my shirts say Christ the King. I have been here for 13 years, almost half of my priesthood, I am not sure what it will be like not to be your pastor.

Whatever the loss, the key is that we get to choose our response. You get to decide how you are going to respond. When we lose something, there are 4 response to the loss. We can try to **restore** it. Your house burns down and you build another one exactly to the specifications of the old one. We can **replace** it. Your car breaks down and you upgrade to an SUV with all the latest and greatest features. We can also **redesign** it. You change careers and find one that fits your gifts and talents even better. Finally, we can **relinquish** it. Maybe I need to give up that habit and choose something new. The great news is that we get to choose our response!




Fr. Cody's Corner

Incorruptibility

Following from two months ago when I wrote about relics, I am using this column to write about another strange aspect of Catholicism: incorruptibility. Incorruptibility is when God proves the holiness of a person by preventing

their body from decaying, delaying the process, or preventing part of the body from decaying. The prime examples of incorruptible saints include St. Therese of Lisieux, St. Catherine of Sienna, St. Camil-

lus de Lellis, and St. Rita of Cascia. Incorruptibility has many nuances and aspects. The saints listed above lived at least 500 years ago and their bodies remain in the state as though they were sleeping. If you don't believe me, look up some pictures of these saints. In contrast to the perfectly preserved saints, some saints only had part of their body remain incorrupt while the rest of the body decomposed such as an arm like St. Ambrose of England. In other cases the body decomposes incredibility slowly taking several centuries as opposed to several years.

The reason for incorruptibility is largely unknown. The most common theory is that incorruptibility shows two important aspects of the saint: their holiness and the importance of the body. In cases like the arm of St. Ambrose, his arm remained incorrupt because he was blessing someone as his arm got cut off. This type of incorruptibility shows God's action working through the saint. By preserving the body from corruption, God is showing that the holiness of the person prevents even decay and that they already participate in the joys of Heaven in which there is no decay. Leading to the second part: the importance of the body. Incorrupt saints show us the value of the body itself and that God preserves who we are and maintains even the shape of our bodies as something important to him.

Final point: how does one get declared incorrupt? The process is simple and complicated. After the death of the person, the person is buried. Upon being canonized a saint, usually the body is exhumed or exhumed in the process for the sake of veneration and verification of the holiness of the person. If upon being exhumed the body doesn't exhibit signs of corruption, then it is reburied. Thirty years later the body is exhumed again and checked for signs of decay. If during the second examination the body doesn't exhibit signs of decay, the person is declared incorrupt. This process may take longer or numerous inspections depending on the condition of the body. This process is expedited if the person died many years before being canonized. Bodies that were embalmed or sealed in an air-tight coffin are not considered incorrupt.

Fr. Jeff's Note Cont.

Once we acknowledge our losses and choose our responses, we then have to **celebrate**. If we don't celebrate the endings, it is hard to move through the transition. We mark the end to move to the new. Celebrations help us commit to moving forward (Join us for our parish celebration, details for which can be found just to the right of this note).

The Neutral Zone — we now move into the neutral zone, and this is hard. It is here that we find that the old is gone, but the new doesn't feel right, yet. To move through the neutral zone, you need to have **concern** and **care** for each other. You need to be a community with and for each other. You need to take care of each other. Also as a parish, you will need to remember our **purpose** — remember why you are a parish.

Remember the **picture** we have created as a welcoming community of faith. Remember the parish **plan** for the future, our vision. Finally, and this is most important, you need to claim and do your **part**. Everyone needs to do their **part** to make this parish the parish the Holy Spirit is moving it to be. You are needed to accomplish this work. You need to be in the game!

The New Beginning — and then you realize that the new beginning has happened!

I hope this has been helpful to you; it has been very helpful to me as I journey through this transition. I look forward to celebrating with you in the coming days.
